Monday – November 27

Introduction



Image to Ponder:

How do you prepare for Christmas?

How do you prepare for the day when you will meet Jesus face to face, either in this life or the world to come?

What are you bringing to Jesus

this Advent season?

Luke 21:25-28, 34-36²⁵ “There will be signs in the sun, moon and stars. On the earth, nations will be in anguish and perplexity at the roaring and tossing of the sea. ²⁶ People will faint from terror, apprehensive of what is coming on the world, for the heavenly bodies will be shaken. ²⁷ At that time they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. ²⁸ When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.”

³⁴ “Be careful, or your hearts will be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness and the anxieties of life, and that day will close on you suddenly like a trap. ³⁵ For it will come on all those who live on the face of the whole earth. ³⁶ Be always on the watch, and pray that you may be able to escape all that is about to happen, and that you may be able to stand before the Son of Man.”

Thoughts to Consider:

Imagine that King Charles, or Connor McDavid, or Taylor Swift was coming to your house. The excitement could turn to panic as you consider how to prepare for their coming. In the same way, Jesus tells us that he will return and “Every eye shall see, and every tongue

confess that He is LORD.” Advent is about getting ready for his appearing. We don’t know when that day will be, so we need to have our lives clean and in order. We don’t want our lives to be full of bitterness, greed, selfishness and unclean living. In that way, we can be excited about the fact that Jesus is returning and anticipate it with hope, peace, joy and love.

Prayer:

Thank you, God, for the promise that Jesus will one day return. Through your Holy Spirit, help us to be ready for that day by living lives that are pleasing to you. Thank you for forgiving us when we tell you we have done wrong. We want to welcome King Jesus at his coming and so to share the joy of his rule. Amen

Tuesday – November 28 Jesus Our Humble King



Image to Ponder:

Which animal would you expect to see in a parade that featured the King?

Tradition tells us that Jesus started his life in a stable with a donkey. He ended it riding into Jerusalem on a donkey.

What does that tell us about his ministry?

Matthew 21:1-11 (NIV)

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them, “Go to the village ahead of you, and at once you will find a donkey tied there, with her colt by her. Untie them and bring them to me. ³ If

anyone says anything to you, say that the Lord needs them, and he will send them right away.”

⁴ This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet:

⁵ “Say to Daughter Zion,
‘See, your king comes to you,
gentle and riding on a donkey,
and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.’”

⁶ The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them. ⁷ They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on. ⁸ A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted,

“Hosanna to the Son of David!”

“Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!”

“Hosanna in the highest heaven!”

¹⁰ When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, “Who is this?”

¹¹ The crowds answered, “This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee.”

Prayer:

Jesus, we associate the humble donkey with your birth and the triumphal entry into Jerusalem. You deserved a royal parade as the King of Kings, but instead you arrived as a servant. Teach us to set aside our need to be recognized and praised in order to serve you in the ordinary places of our world. Amen

Wednesday - November 29
The Coronation

2 Peter 1:16-19

¹⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised stories when we told you about the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in power, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ He received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain.

¹⁹ We also have the prophetic message as something completely reliable, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

Matthew 21:12-17

¹² Jesus entered the temple courts and drove out all who were buying and selling there. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the benches of those selling doves. ¹³ “It is written,” he said to them, “My house will be called a house of prayer,’ but you are making it ‘a den of robbers.’”

¹⁴ The blind and the lame came to him at the temple, and he healed them. ¹⁵ But when the chief priests and the teachers of the law saw the wonderful things he did and the children shouting in the temple courts, “Hosanna to the Son of David,” they were indignant.

¹⁶ “Do you hear what these children are saying?” they asked him. “Yes,” replied Jesus, “have you never read,

“‘From the lips of children and infants, you, Lord, have called forth your praise’?”

Prayer:

We consider who you are, Lord Jesus, as we journey through advent. We believe the accounts of eyewitnesses who were there throughout your ministry, including the sick, the lame, the poor, and children. They could not be silenced because they had been with you, and they believed. May our hearts be open to just such an encounter. Amen

Thursday – November 30 God’s Timing

2 Peter 3:3-10

³Above all, you must understand that in the last days scoffers will come, scoffing and following their own evil desires. ⁴They will say, "Where is this 'coming' he promised? Ever since our ancestors died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation." ⁵But they deliberately forget that long ago by God's word the heavens came into being and the earth was formed out of water and by water. ⁸But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. ⁹The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. ¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come like a thief.

Acts 1:7-12

⁷He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

⁹After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.

¹⁰They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. ¹¹"Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

Prayer:

Lord, your people waited for thousands of years for you to send the Messiah. When he came, he was rejected. We too have waited thousands of years for you to return and set the world right. Let us be ready and live in joyful anticipation of that day. Amen

Friday – December 1
Be Prepared to Meet Jesus



Image to Ponder:

What needs to be done to prepare this space for important guests?

What areas of your life need to be cleaned up as you prepare for your advent journey?

2 Peter 3:11-14

^{11b} You ought to live holy and godly lives ¹² as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. ¹³ But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells.

¹⁴ So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with him. ¹⁵ Bear in mind that our Lord's patience means salvation.

1 Thessalonians 5:5-10

Now, brothers and sisters, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, ²for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³While people are saying, "Peace and safety," destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape.

⁴But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. ⁵You are all children of the light and children of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. ⁶So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be awake and sober. ⁷For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. ⁸But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. ⁹For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁰He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, examine our hearts and point out areas where we need your work of forgiveness and healing. We are serious about living lives that honour you. Thank you that your grace is sufficient for our salvation. Amen

Saturday – December 2

The Advent Log



The Advent Log is a simple idea that helps us focus upon our preparation for the coming of Jesus' birth. The four outside candles represent the four Sundays of Advent and the one in the middle is the Christ candle that is lit on Christmas day.

December 3rd - we light our first candle of hope.

December 10th – we light the second candle of peace.

December 17th – we light the third candle (the pink one), of joy.

December 24th – we light the fourth candle of love

December 25th – we light the white Christ candle

Sunday - December 3 First Sunday of Advent

I John 3:1-3

See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ² Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. ³ All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

Prayer:

Dear Lord, as we begin Advent this year help us to be like children. We want to anticipate your coming with hope, peace, joy and love. Monday – December 4 The Feast is Ready



Image to Ponder:

How would you feel if you prepared a special meal and no one came?

Who are the people you want to share a meal with?

Who are the people you would never invite?

Are there those who come to a communion table in this world that you would be uncomfortable standing next to?

Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus spoke to them again in parables, saying: ² “The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son. ³ He sent his servants to those who had been invited to the banquet to tell them to come, but they refused to come.

⁴ “Then he sent some more servants and said, ‘Tell those who have been invited that I have prepared my dinner: My oxen and fattened cattle have been butchered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding banquet.’

⁵ “But they paid no attention and went off—one to his field, another to his business. ⁶ The rest seized his servants, mistreated them and killed them. ^{7a} The king was enraged.

⁸ “Then he said to his servants, ‘The wedding banquet is ready, but those I invited did not deserve to come. ⁹ So go to the street corners and invite to the banquet anyone you find.’ ¹⁰ So the servants went out into the streets and gathered all the people they could find, the bad as well as the good, and the wedding hall was filled with guests.

¹⁴ “For many are invited, but few are chosen.”

Prayer:

Lord, you invite us to come to your communion table. Remind us that it is a special invitation for all who come to you in faith. Let us be accepting of those who join with us regardless of who they are or where they come from. Help us to practice hospitality toward strangers and outsiders, and to become like Jesus who “ate with tax collectors and sinners.” Amen

Tuesday – December 5

Miracle Babies



Image to Ponder:

John and Baptist and Jesus were relatives: one born to a barren woman and the other to a virgin. Why is that significant?

What role did John play in Jesus's ministry?

Luke 1:36-42

The angel [told Mary], "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born in you will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth, your relative is going to have a child in her old age. . . For nothing is impossible with God."

At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, ⁴⁰ where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴² In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear!

⁵⁶ Mary stayed with Elizabeth for about three months and then returned home.

⁵⁷ When it was time for Elizabeth to have her baby, she gave birth to a son. ⁵⁸ Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown her great mercy, and they shared her joy.

⁵⁹ On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him after his father Zechariah, ⁶⁰ but his mother spoke up and said, “No! He is to be called John.”

⁶¹ They said to her, “There is no one among your relatives who has that name.”⁶² Then they made signs to his father, to find out what he would like to name the child. ⁶³ He asked for a writing tablet, and to everyone’s astonishment he wrote, “His name is John.” ⁶⁴ Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue set free, and he began to speak, praising God. ⁶⁶ Everyone who heard this wondered about it, asking, “What then is this child?”

Prayer:

Lord, Jesus was born into an extended family of faith. Scripture tells us how his relative, John, had a special purpose in making him known. When we are discouraged about our lives, help us to remember that you have a plan for us and that this purpose fits into your plan for the family of faith created by Jesus. Let our primary goal be to glorify your name. Amen

Wednesday – December 6 **Jesus Our Shepherd**



Image to Ponder:

The child holds the lamb; her father holds them both. We hold in our hearts those whom we love. Who do you hold close?

How does it make you feel to know that Jesus carries you?

What makes you tired or weary as you journey to Bethlehem? How does Jesus comfort you?

Isaiah 40ff

Comfort, comfort my people,
says your God. ² Speak
tenderly to Jerusalem, and
proclaim to her that her hard
service has been completed,
that her sin has been paid for,
that she has received from
the LORD's hand double for all
her sins. ⁵ And the glory of
the LORD will be revealed,
and all people will see it
together. You who bring good
news to Jerusalem, lift up your
voice with a shout, lift it up, do
not be afraid; say to the towns
of Judah, "Here is your God!"
¹⁰ See, the Sovereign
LORD comes with power,
and he rules with a mighty
arm. ¹¹ He tends his flock like a

shepherd: He gathers the
lambs in his arms and carries
them close to his heart; he
gently leads those that have
young.

²⁸ Do you not know? Have you
not heard? The LORD is the
everlasting God, the Creator of
the ends of the earth. He will
not grow tired or weary, and
his understanding no one can
fathom. ²⁹ He gives strength to
the weary and increases the
power of the weak. ³⁰ Even
youths grow tired and weary,
and young men stumble and
fall; ³¹ but those who hope in
the LORD will renew their
strength. They will soar on
wings like eagles; they will run
and not grow wear

Prayer:

Lord, we are your children and we long for you to carry us when we
are tired, afraid, sick, or overwhelmed. At times we just need to sit in
silence and listen to what you have to say to us. Let us feel your
presence in a real way as we come to you this moment in prayer.
Amen

Thursday – December 7
Jesus the Light of the World



Image to Ponder:

Jesus brought justice and peace to the world by shining His light in the darkness. What sorts of things hide in the darkness?

How does exposing sin to the light help to eliminate it?

How is hidden sin the enemy of peace?

Isaiah 42

“Here is my servant, whom I uphold,

my chosen one in whom I delight;

I will put my Spirit on him,
and he will bring justice to the nations.

² He will not shout or cry out,
or raise his voice in the streets.

³ A bruised reed he will not break,
and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out.

In faithfulness he will bring forth justice;

⁴ he will not falter or be discouraged

till he establishes justice on earth.

⁶ “I, the LORD, have called you in righteousness;

I will take hold of your hand.
I will keep you and will make you

to be a covenant for the people

and a light for the Gentiles,

⁷ to open eyes that are blind,
to free captives from prison
and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness.

John 3:19-21

¹⁹ This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. ²⁰ Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. ²¹ But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus the world longs for peace. Hear the cries of the people caught in the grip of war. Eliminate evil ambition and hatred and champion truth and light. Give us the courage to expose our sin to the light so that we can have enjoy true peace and forgiveness. Amen

Friday – December 8th Jesus Our Deliverer



Image to Ponder:

your transgressions, for my own sake,

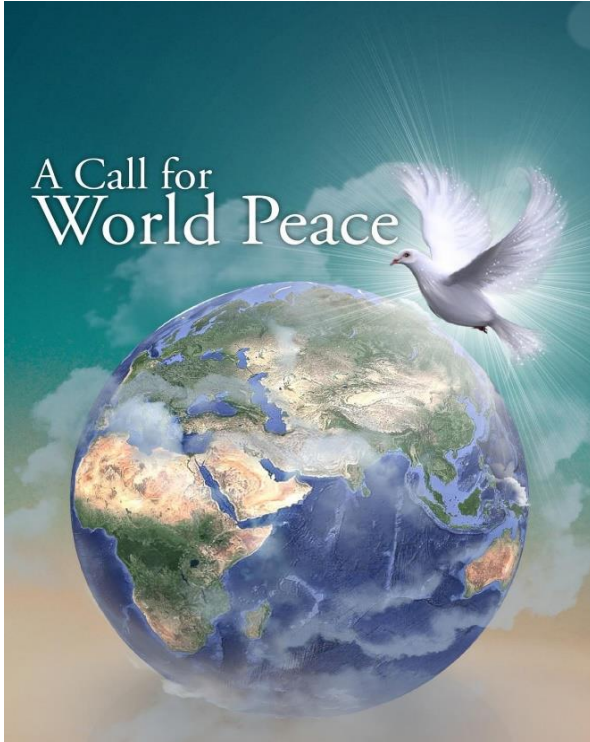
and remembers your sins no more..

however, took oil in jars along with their lamps. ⁵ The bridegroom was a long time in coming, and they all became drowsy and fell asleep.

⁶ "At midnight the cry rang out: 'Here's the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!'

⁷ "Then all the virgins woke up and trimmed their lamps. ⁸ The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil; our lamps are going out.'

⁹ "No,' they replied, 'there may not be enough for both us and you. Instead, go to those who sell oil and buy some for yourselves.'

¹⁰ “But while they were on their way to buy the oil, the bridegroom arrived. The virgins who were ready went in with him to the wedding banquet. And the door was shut.

¹¹ “Later the others also came. ‘Lord, Lord,’ they said, ‘open the door for us!’

¹² “But he replied, ‘Truly I tell you, I don’t know you.’

¹³ “Therefore keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour.

Prayer:

O holy, patient, and loving God, in this season of grace-filled longing, we await the coming of your Son and our Savior. In the midst of our busy lives, we need your help to remind us of what is important and necessary. The one gift that will last comes from you alone, gracious God, as we grow in our awareness of your love. Bless us, our family and friends. What does it mean to

What does it mean that “Nothing can separate us from the love of God?”

Romans 8:28-38

²⁸ And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. ²⁹ For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. ³⁰ And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified.

³¹ What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³² He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? ³³ Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? ³⁶ As it is written:

“For your sake we face death all day long;
we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.”

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, ³⁹ neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, you have won the battle over sin and death. We get caught up in uncertainty about the future, regrets from the past, and circumstances in the present that are beyond our control. From worry about passing a test or going to the dentist, to the threats to world peace and climate change, we feel helpless and either choose to ignore things, or push through with determination and positive self-talk. Yet, you have won the final victory over all that threatens to
